Handout for Publishing your Dissertation:

Although you have successfully passed your disputation, your doctorate is not complete until you have published your dissertation. Only then will you receive your Doctoral Degree Certificate (*Urkunde*) and have the right to use the doctoral title.

Here are some important details for you:

Annotation in Dissertation:

All publications must contain the following note (e.g. in the foreword or in the introduction)

This dissertation was accepted by the Faculty of Human Sciences of the University of Cologne in ... (please insert month and year of your oral examination). (Decision of the Doctoral Committee on 10 October 2010)

Revision Certificate:

Before starting the publication process, please clarify with your supervisors or the examiners of your dissertation whether any changes have been requested in the evaluations that need to be fulfilled before the final publication. The revision form must be signed by your first and second examiners.

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If the title of the dissertation needs to be changed for the publication, you will have to hand in a formal request (with the approval of your examiners) to the Doctoral Committee (*Promotionsausschuss*).

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You must submit the following documents to the Doctoral Office:

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- When publishing with a publishing house: A Copy of the publishing contract with a confirmation about the print run (at least 150 copies)

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Submission:

All proof copies must be handed in at the *USB Köln*, Abteilung "Tausch, Geschenk, Hochschulschriften und Institutsaussonderungen". Afterwards, an acknowledgment of receipt will be sent to the Doctoral Office automatically.

The following only applies to publication-based dissertation

Please note that if you have written a publication-based dissertation the final process of publication will only be deemed complete according to the Doctoral Regulations once the cover text has also been published (for example in <u>KUPS</u> with bibliographical reference to the individual works).

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In the case of a monographic dissertation with partial publications the final process of publication will only be deemed complete according to the Doctoral Regulations once each previously unpublished part of the dissertation has also been published finally (with clear references to the separately published partial publications). For example the publication can be done on <u>KUPS</u>.
